THE PROJECT

UPDATE OF COMPETENCES

This small-scale partnership in adult education is rooted on the belief that Education organizations need to take action to respond to the climate emergency and planetary crisis both in terms of their own operations and strategies and, crucially, as regards the preparation of their targeted learners for the future.

Moreover, the Partners are convinced that the current severe crisis (covid pandemic, return of war in Europe) have given an acceleration to the necessity of transformation that were pre-existing, for instance as response to tackle climate change, to mitigate them and or adapt to them. In some field of education there's evidence of developing trends on greening, with many organizations already environmental involved initiatives in on sustainability on its mainstreaming in connection crossfertilisation with other on-going transformation processes, such as for instance digitalisation, social inclusion and enhancement of learning and teaching.

The main target group of the project are the trainers/teachers, management and staff in general within the Partner Organizations, active in the domain of lifelong learning and adult education, for which the challenge posed by the delivery of the EU Green Deal represent a valuable opportunity, in how to ensure the effective contribution of the educational sector towards the green transition. As in other sectors, adult education and lifelong learnina organizations has to consider the beneficial potential in embracing, at least in part of its strains, the EU Green Deal as a way to equip its staff with new knowledge and skills which will be beneficial as a consequence to the targeted audience of learners as well as to the reference community.

In fact, when it comes to adult skills and training, there are several challenges to achieve a smooth green transition, since many adults, especially in disadvantaged areas may have low basic skills and this may be a major challenge for upskilling, reskilling and overall employment.

meeting 1:

21 October 2023, Bucharest (Romania): to empower participants on the following EU Green Deal pillars: "Making transport sustainable for all", "Leading the third industrial revolution" and "Cleaning our energy system".
